Sermon Notes:

Amos 1:1-2

There is something in us that likes to be a little scared - so long as we are safe.

- o Maybe that's partly why we like seeing Lions in the zoo at feeding time.
- o But take away the safety glass and the experience would be very different!
- o That is the image at the start of Amos the Lord as a roaring Lion (v2)

We might be tempted to say this isn't the way we like to think of God

o We like to think of God as 'only loving and kind'.

But Amos 1:2 is the real God

o not a god of our imaginations

What does Proverbs 1:7 tell us?

- 'The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge'
- o It is the very first baby step in knowledge to fear God
- So is there any fear of the Lord in your worship of Him?
- o Or has your relationship with Him become mundane or just matey?

Below are some verses to help us fear the Lord - how about using one each day this week at the start of your personal Bible and prayer times.

Isaiah 6:3
 Revelation 4:8
 Proverbs 1:7
 Exodus 15:11
 Luke 5:8
 Psalm 96:6

There are 3 things to notice about the Lion's roar from verses 1-2 of Amos 1...

1. The roar has been a long time coming.

Have a look at verse 1 to see when Amos prophesied...

- o We don't know exactly when the earthquake was
- o But we do know when the Kings reigned in the 8th century BC.

We need to remember this isn't the first thing the Lord said to Israel.

- o The Lord has been speaking to them for hundreds of years.
- The Lord chose them, provided for them generously, rescued them over and over again and forgiven them many times.
- To see how God has revealed himself see Exodus 34:6-7
- o Given who God is and how he has dealt with the Israelites, we should ask at the beginning of Amos: What did the Israelites do to make a loving, compassionate God into a roaring Lion? We will see the answer over the coming weeks.
- But for now we just need to see the patience of the Lord.

The Lord is still patient with us – but we mustn't mistake His patience for indifference.

- o If we rebel against the Lord we may well find...life is OK.
- o But that doesn't mean the Lord approves he is being patient.
- o Lord's patience will, at some point, end we need to be warned.

2. You can't run from the Lion's roar

- o In verse 2 Amos uses the extremes to convey the idea that the whole of Israel will feel the blast of the Lord's roar
- o The pastures in the South to the Mountains in the North
- o All will feel its force

We too need to remember that when the Lord judges we can't run from Him.

- We won't escape
- If you are living in rebellion against God running from Him, be aware you can't escape by running away from God

So what are we to do?

3. The only escape is to run towards the Lion

- o This isn't a tip if you were to meet a Lion in the wilds of Africa!
- o But in Amos the only escape from the Lord's roar is to run to Him.
- Chapter 5:6 'Seek the Lord and live'
- o We get a hint of this in verse 2. Did you see where the Lion roars from?

He roars from Jerusalem. This is significant...

- o Jerusalem was in the Southern Kingdom Judah.
- Israel (Northern Kingdom) had set up their own places of worship the Lord is saying that Jerusalem is still the place He has chosen.
- o But also, remember what is in Jerusalem...the temple.
- o And the temple was a place of wrath and mercy
- o If you were an Israelite and you had sinned you were to take an animal to the temple to be sacrificed.
- o The animal dies in your place, taking wrath, so you can receive mercy
- So, where should an Israelite in Amos' day go to be forgiven Jerusalem! Right into the Lion's den.
- What about us? We don't go to the temple, but to the cross of Jesus. The
 ultimate place where wrath and mercy meet.
- o Don't run from the Lord because of your sin, run to Him with your sin.
- o His promise is that all who confess their sins will be forgiven (see 1John 1:9)
- o So don't run away from the Lord run to Him. It is the only escape.

So we have started into Amos and have heard the Lion roar. How will you respond?
